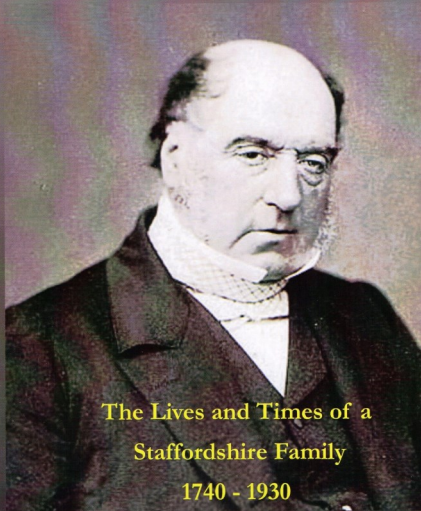


The Littletons of Teddesley Hall

Based on the diaries of 3 generations of the family, especially that of the **First Lord Hatherton**, (1797-1863), diarist extraordinaire, witty social and political observations, poignant and melodramatic private life.

Sir Edward Littleton – builder of Teddesley Hall, Littleton Arms and the canal, MP, living with **Mary Barker** (a friend of Wordsworth), 45 years his junior

Anne Walhouse, mother of Lord Hatherton, a woman so strong the people called her “Sir”.

Hyacinth Wellesley, the First Lady Hatherton, beautiful niece of **Duke of Wellington**. **Richard Wellesley**, her outrageous father. **Emily** and **Cynthy**, her doomed daughters.

From the 1745 Rebellion to the Zulu War and Rourke’s Drift, the Indian Mutiny and the Opium War and the First World War. The **Second Lord Hatherton** and the early years of the Littleton Colliery and the Walsall Arboretum . The **Third Lord Hatherton**, and the age of democracy, the County Council and the General Strike, and much more.
